Juice and Drink Pouch Recycling



Every year, billions of drink pouches end up in dumpsters and landfills across America. TerraCycle converts the drink pouch material into innovative products from tote bags and pencil cases to plastic lumber and pavers! Prairie Trail has recycled over 5,000 Pouches as of 12-31-2013.

The Drink Pouch Brigade allows schools, non-profit organizations, or individuals to save drink pouches from taking up space in landfills. Each pouch can be redeemed for CASH our school while teaching this lesson of recycling.

ALL Juice and Drink Pouches are accepted regardless of brand (aluminum or plastic pouches).

Just finish your drink, remove the straw and put the pouch in the collection bin—no washing or rinsing required.

The collection container will be in the lunchroom. Please collect your pouches from home and bring them to school.

AmazonSmile



The PTO registered with the AmazonSmile program. This program donates 0.5% of the

Once your account is linked, you have to shop from www.smile.amazon.com in order for purchases to be eligible. Items purchased through the Amazon.com or the Amazon app are not eligible, but you may save items in your cart, and then hit purchase from the AmazonSmile website. To make things easier, we recommend you bookmark the AmazonSmile site or downloading the "one click" desktop app when you link your account.

Pizza Ranch Box Tabs (WAGON WHEELS)

How it Works
